Mayor Witt called the meeting to order. Schmidt made a motion to approve the minutes from the previous meetings. Clement seconded the motion. All voted in favor with Farley abstaining. Motion carried.

Hofferber made a motion to approve the purchase orders through consent agenda. Farley seconded the motion. All voted in favor. Motion carried. Treasurer Report and Budget Reports were also reviewed. There was no Public Comments.

Winter Roybal told Council there was 8,750,000 gallons of water pumped with 4 water leaks repaired. The sewer pumped 3,209,904 gallons into the lagoons with 1 issue sewer reported. Sprinkler is currently broken down, service call has been made. No action has been taken in regard to the fence for the land application field. One new gas meter was installed. PRC is here this month to do odorant testing. Lorenz St will be chip sealed this year by the County. TCEC has been notified of the broken street light globes. There was one call regarding the alley. Alley was taken care of. About 114 tons of trash was dumped for March with 3 calls about trash. Trash Truck was failing to regen, issue has been fixed. Received \$450 in Landfill revenue. High winds caused temporary issue with payment terminal for fuel pumps and broke a fitting, all issues fixed. There were 3 grave openings. Holes were filled in around the Cemetery. Water is back on and hoses have been set out at the Cemetery. Northwest Line has been called to fix outlet in circle by flagpole. The water at the pool is turned back on. Plumbing has been reconnected and checked for leaks. Chlorine, pool ladder steps, replacement lifeguard chair, table & chairs, picnic tables, cabinet and new lounge chairs have been delivered. Parks signs are falling apart and look terrible. Funding is available to replace them. Total of 70 work orders were completed for March with 11 line locates done. We received \$2,000 from OMAG Safety and purchased new safety equipment with that grant.

Carina Roybal said she is very concerned about the federal grant/state funding. She attended the Oklahoma Library Association Annual Conference March 12-14. The Library is working on inventory. The trim has been replaced between the front doors. The Service Agreement with PTCL regarding the E-Rate has been renewed along with firewall and internet services. Liberal Memorial Library is helping us get our 3D printer. Carina went to the OKC State Library on March 31<sup>st</sup> for Resource Roundup for free materials. Skylar is now certified.

Scott Hedrick talked about a couple options regarding a vehicle upgrade for Officer Garcia.

Schmidt made a motion to approve pool employees employment for this summer. Farley seconded the motion. All voted in favor. Motion carried.

Farley voted to take no action in regard to Rick McMichael's complaint about the intersection of Golf and Lorenz St. Schmidt seconded the motion. All voted in favor. Motion carried.

Schmidt made a motion to take no action regarding Rick McMichael's complaint about Lorenz St because that street will be chip sealed this year. Farley seconded the motion. All voted in favor. Motion carried.

Schmidt made a motion to approve Resolution 2025-4 amending landfill fees. Hofferber seconded the motion. All voted in favor. Motion carried.

Schmidt made a motion to take no action regarding the alley behind house at 112 Memorial St due to it already being taken care of. Farley seconded the motion. All voted in favor. Motion carried.

Farley made a motion after hearing from HALO group regarding the Mesta Memorial 5K Run to approve the street closure on Broadway Street from Glaydas to alley from 7 AM to 12 noon on Saturday, April 19<sup>th</sup>. Schmidt seconded the motion. All voted in favor. Motion carried.

Regarding the request for a Hooker Market at the pavilion from Robin Cook during summer on Saturday evenings, Schmidt made a motion to approve request. Clement seconded the motion. All voted in favor. Motion carried.

Hofferber made a motion to appoint Molly Clement for the Ward 4 unexpired term position. Schmidt seconded the motion. All voted in favor. Motion carried.

After some discussion regarding the Parks Signs, Schmidt me a motion to approve the Parks Sign updates with Davis Park and any other parks needed not to exceed \$4959.70 to be taken from the City Park Trail Fund. Farley seconded the motion. All voted in favor. Motion carried.

Witt talked about issues with the dip on Glaydas St during the Mayor's Report. He received a letter from Greg Arnold with valid points and would like to get a plan to get the dip taken care of.

There was no new business, so Farley made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Clement seconded the motion. All voted in favor. Motion carried.
